As of the beginning of the 2023 academic year, the initial batch of students will arrive on the Luxemburg premises as part of their mandatory semester abroad in the 3rd year of ESSCA's



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Grande Ecole programme. ESSCA in Luxemburg will step up operations in respect of its guiding principles: competence, humanism, solidarity, responsibility, ambition, honesty, autonomy, and imagination, without overlooking a passion for innovation and concerted involvement in societal and environmental issues. One event is already scheduled to take place at ESSCA Luxemburg on 20th June on the theme of climate challenges, featuring the appearance of Runa Kahn (Chair and Founder of the NGO Friendship), James Monnat (CEO of Foundry) and Associate Professor and Researcher Sonia Chickh M'Hamed (ESSCA).

An entire community is already assembling around the school via the implication of alumni and ESSCA partners. Around 60 former students out of the 150 active alumni in Luxemburg were present in March at the first ESSCA event held in Luxemburg, one that promises to be the first of many. Closely in touch with its environment and open to the world at large, the school intends to establish links with a series of academic, institutional, and economic partners in order to roll out a motivating, responsible and thought-provoking ecosystem for the benefit of its students and their continuing development, as well as profiting the city of Luxemburg itself, its appeal, and its economy.
