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# ESSCA creates a Master in Management and Business Engineering aimed at science and engineering students, in tandem with Dassault Systèmes and IBM

Faced with the growing need of companies for talents offering a blend of technical expertise and strategic vision, ESSCA is rolling out a new Master in Management and MSc double degree: the Master in Management and Business Engineering. The programme will be launched in September 2025 on the School's Lyon campus, comprising a 16-month accelerated training designed specifically for French and international engineering and scientific profiles.

Devised in tandem with top industry figures such as Dassault Systèmes and IBM, the programme meets a dual objective: to provide students with the keys to navigate complex environments and meet the requirements of companies.

With the launch of this new curriculum, ESSCA continues to respond to the main challenges of companies, economic and industrial sovereignty and transitions.

# An intensive set-up designed to train hybrid talents

This programme is aimed at graduates with three years of post-secondary studies from scientific educational backgrounds such as engineering, who have obtained 180 ECTS credits and with international projects in mind. By joining directly the fourth year of ESSCA's Masters in Management programme, engineering students will benefit from an intensive learning schedule over 12 months, alternating between theoretical classes, the study of practical cases, and then an in-company internship.

# The programme combines:

- 12 months of courses: classes in management, strategy and leadership specially tailored to industrial and technological issues and taught in English. Students develop project management, decision-making, communications and organisational skills, whilst consolidating their understanding of technical environments and engineering management.
- An end-of-study internship: lasting a minimum four months, the internship enables students to put into practice the knowledge already acquired within corporate partners.





This dual skillset, which is especially sought after in sectors such as aeronautics, automobile and cutting-edge technology, prepares future graduates for key positions such as industrial project manager, business analyst and head of innovation.

Franck Gavoille, Director of ESSCA's Master in Management, declares: "by launching this programme, ESSCA is appealing to students with advanced scientific skills, for example engineers looking to hone their ability to manage projects and teams and take strategic decisions for senior positions. These multi-talented profiles are highly sought after."

# A programme devised with highly renowned companies

Dassault Systèmes and IBM have contributed directly to designing the teaching content of the programme, ensuring that it responds to current technological and managerial issues. These companies will be able to participate in numerous ways, such as providing guest lecturers and case studies or receiving students on internships, thereby strengthening their employability and their transition into working life. In turn, students will be able to take advantage of the IBM SkillsBuild scheme, a free education programme that helps apprentices develop the most sought-after digital skills on the employment market (AI, Cybersecurity, Data Science, Sustainable Development...) and obtain digital certificates.
